A Reading from the Book of Joel Blow the trumpet in Zion! Sound the alarm on my holy mountain! Let all the inhabitants of the land tremble, for the day of God is coming. It is near.

"Yet even now," says God, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; but rend your hearts and not your clothing." Return to your God who is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger, abounding in kindness, ready to yield even as disaster looms. You never know: God may turn back and relent, and leave a blessing behind instead, a blessing enough for grain offerings and libations to be presented to the Holy One, Your God.

Blow the trumpet in Zion! Proclaim a fast. Call a solemn assembly. Gather the people. Summon the community.

Assemble the aged and gather the children, even the nursing infants. Call the bride from her canopy. the bridegroom from his tent.

When you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, so that you do not appear to others to be fasting, except to your Loving God who is hidden. Your Loving God who sees what is hidden will thank you.

Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and decay destroy, and thieves break in and steal. Instead, store up treasures in the heavens, where neither moth nor decay destroy, nor thieves break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be.

- 7. Lastly, let us pray for those Special Intentions we will now speak aloud, record in the chat box, or affectionately cherish in our hearts ...
